

Minor in Science of Natural and Environmental Systems

DESCRIPTION OF THE MINOR

The Minor Program of Study in SNES consists of the five required courses from the SNES Environmental Core (14 credits), and the SNES Senior Capstone Course (3 credits). All courses except SNES 2000 must be taken for a letter grade, and a grade of "C" or better must be received to count towards the SNES minor. Any undergraduate student may enroll in the minor, subject to availability in required courses.

A. Environmental Core

1. Biotic Systems: BIOEE 1610: Ecology and the Environment (3 credits)*
2. Earth Systems: CSS 3650: Environmental Chemistry: Soil, Air and Water (3 credits)*

How to receive credit for the Minor Program of Study in Science of Natural and Environmental Systems:

1. Submit a copy of this form to the SNES Advising Coordinator, Suzanne Wapner, 8 Fernow Hall. Retain a copy for your records and give your major advisor a copy for your file.
2. Complete the courses required for the SNES minor.
3. In the final semester prior to graduation, bring a copy of your transcript and your "Application to Graduate" to the SNES Advising Coordinator, Suzanne Wapner, 8 Fernow Hall. Upon verification of the *successful* completion of all required courses, a designated SNES representative will sign the form as required for the minor.
